# All Terrier Club of Western Washington 

## CONSTITUTION

## ARTICLE I <br> Name and Objects

SECTION 1. The name of the club shall be All Terrier Club of Western Washington (ATCWW).
SECTION 2. The objectives of the club shall be:
(a) to urge members and breeders to accept the standard of the breeds as approved by the American Kennel Club as the only standard of excellence by which Terriers shall be judged.
(b) to encourage and promote quality in the breeding of purebred AKC recognized Terrier breeds and to do all possible to bring their natural qualities to perfection;
(c) to do all in its power to protect and advance the interests of the breed by encouraging sportsmanlike competition at dog shows
(d) to conduct sanctioned matches, and any other event for which the club is eligible under the Rules and Regulations of the American Kennel Club.

SECTION 3. The club shall not be conducted or operated for profit and no part of any profits or remainder residue from dues or donations to the club shall inure to the benefit of any member or individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions on furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Constitution or in Article I of the Bylaws.

SECTION 4. The members of the club shall adopt and may from time to time revise such bylaws as may be required to carry out these objectives.

## BYLAWS

## ARTICLE I <br> Membership

SECTION 1. Eligibility. There shall be five types of membership open to all persons 18 years of age and older who are in good standing with the American Kennel Club and who subscribe to the purposes of this Club.
(a) Regular (Individual) - Enjoys all club privileges including the right to vote and hold office.
(b) Household - Two adult members residing in the same household, each eligible to vote and hold office.
(c) Associate (Individual) — Entitled to all club privileges except voting and office holding.
(d) Household Associate - Two adult members residing in the same household, entitled to all club privileges except voting and office holding.
(e) Life - For those individuals who have been members for a long period of time (usually 20+ years); Life members pay no dues but are eligible to vote and hold office.

While membership is to be unrestricted as to residence, the club's primary purpose is to be representative of the breeders and exhibitors in its immediate area.

SECTION 2. Dues. Membership dues shall not exceed $\$ 50$ per year, payable on or before the 1 st day of January of each year. No member may vote whose dues are not paid for the current year. During the month of November the Treasurer shall send to each member a statement of dues for the ensuing year.

SECTION 3. Election to Membership. Each applicant for membership shall apply on a form as approved by the board of directors ("Board" or 'the Board") and which shall provide that the applicant agrees to abide by the constitution, bylaws, code of ethics, and the rules of the American Kennel Club. The application shall state the name, address, and occupation of the applicant and it shall carry the endorsement of two members in good standing. Accompanying the application, the prospective member shall submit dues payment for the current year.

All applications are to be filed with the Secretary and each application will be summarized and sent by mail or email to the voting members of the club at least 10 days prior to the next meeting after its receipt. At the next club meeting the application will be considered. Unanimous consent will elect the applicant, or, failing that, affirmative votes of two thirds of the voting eligible members present and voting by secret ballot at that meeting shall be required to elect thevo applicant.

Applicants for membership who have been rejected by the club may not reapply within six

months after such rejection.
SECTION 4. Termination of Membership. Memberships may be terminated:
(a) by resignation. Any member in good standing may resign from the club upon written notice to the Secretary, but no member may resign when in debt to the club. Obligations other than dues are considered a debt to the club and must be paid in full prior to resignation from the club.
(b) by lapsing. A membership will be considered as lapsed and automatically terminated if such member's dues remain unpaid 30 days after the first day of the fiscal year; however, the Board may grant an additional 30 days of grace to such delinquent members in meritorious cases. In no case may a person be entitled to vote at any club meeting whose dues are unpaid as of the date of that meeting.
(c) by expulsion. A membership may be terminated by expulsion as provided in Article VI of these bylaws.

## ARTICLE II Meetings and Voting

SECTION 1. Club Meetings. Meetings of the club shall be held a minimum of 2 times per year, which shall include a meeting in the month of December, in the Greater Puget Sound area at such hour and place as may be designated by the board of directors. The Board may hold the meeting at a physical location, by electronic conferencing (telephone, video, or similar), or a combination of those. Written or email notice of each such meeting shall be sent by the Secretary at least 10 days prior to the date of the meeting. The quorum for such meetings shall be 20 percent of the eligible voting members in good standing.

SECTION 2. Special Club Meetings. Special club meetings may be called by the President, or by a majority vote of the members of the Board who are present and voting at any regular or special meeting of the Board; and may also be called by the Secretary upon receipt of a petition signed by five members of the club who are in good standing. Such special meetings shall be held in the Greater Puget Sound area at such place, date and hour as may be designated by the person or persons authorized herein to call such meetings. Written notice of such a meeting shall be mailed or emailed by the Secretary at least 5 days and not more than 15 days prior to the date of the meeting, and said notice shall state the purpose of the meeting, and no other club business may be transacted there at. The quorum for such a meeting shall be 20 percent of the eligible voting members in good standing.

SECTION 3. Board Meetings. A minimum of four (4) Board meetings shall be held annually, these meetings may be held in conjunction with regular Club meetings in the Greater Puget Sound area or at a physical location, by electronic conferencing (telephone, video, or similar), or
a combination of those at such hour and place as may be designated by the Board. Written notice of each such meeting shall be mailed or emailed by the Secretary at least five days prior to the date of the meeting. The quorum for such a meeting shall be a majority of the board.

SECTION 4. Special Board Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President; and shall be called by the Secretary upon receipt of a written or email request signed by at least three members of the Board. Such special meetings shall be held at such place, date, and hour as may be designated within the Greater Puget Sound area, or by electronic conferencing, by the person authorized herein to call such meetings. Written or email notice of such meeting shall be sent by the Secretary at least five days and not more than 10 days prior to the date of the meeting. Any such notice shall state the purpose of the meeting and no other business shall be transacted thereat. The quorum for such a meeting shall be a majority of the board.

SECTION 5. Board Actions without a meeting. Any action taken by the Board outside of a meeting requires all Board members to give written consent. Written consent must be in the form of a description of the proposed action, and a signature of the Board member. The written statement of consent must be filed in a timely manner with the Club secretary. The Club secretary must notify members of the action in a timely manner.

SECTION 6. Voting. Each regular, household, or lifetime member in good standing whose dues are paid for the current year shall be entitled to one vote at any meeting of the club at which he/she is present. Proxy voting will not be permitted at any club meeting or election.

## ARTICLE III Directors and Officers

SECTION 1. Board of Directors. The Board shall be comprised of the Officers and three Directors, all of whom shall be members in good standing and all of whom shall be elected for one-year terms at the club's annual meeting as provided in Article IV and shall serve until their successors are elected. General management of the club's affairs shall be entrusted to the

## Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. Officers. The. club's officers, consisting of the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, shall serve in their respective capacities both with regard to the club and its meetings, and the Board and its meetings.
(a) The President shall preside at all meetings of the club and of the Board, and shall have the duties and powers normally appurtenant to the office of President in addition to those particularly specified in these bylaws.
(b) The Vice President shall have the duties and exercise the powers of the President in case of the President's death, absence or incapacity.
(c) The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the club and of the Board and of all matters of which a record shall be ordered by the club; have charge of the correspondence, notify members of meetings, notify new members of their election to membership, notify officers and directors of their election to office, keep a roll of the members of the club with their contact information, which shall be sent to any member in good standing, upon written request, not more than once every club year, and carry out such other duties as are prescribed in these bylaws.
(d) The Treasurer shall collect and receive all moneys due or belonging to the club. Moneys shall be deposited in a bank designated by the Board, in the name of the club. The books shall at all times be open to inspection by the Board and a report shall be given at every meeting on the condition of the club's finances and every item of receipt or payment not before reported; and at the annual meeting an accounting shall be rendered of all moneys received and expended during the previous fiscal year. The Club shall be insured in such an amount and type of policy that the Board shall determine.
(e) The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by the same person, in which case the Board shall be comprised of six persons.

SECTION 3. Vacancies. Any vacancies occurring on the Board or among the officers during the years shall be filled until the next annual election by a majority vote of the members of the Board at its first regular meeting following the creation of such vacancy, or at a special Board meeting called for that purpose; except that a vacancy in the office of President shall be filled automatically by the Vice President until the next annual election, and the resulting vacancy in the office of Vice President shall be filled by the Board.

## ARTICLE IV The Club Year, Annual Meeting, Elections

SECTION 1. Fiscal Year. The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end on the last day of December.

SECTION 2. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held in the month of December, at which Officers and Directors for the ensuing year shall be elected as described in Section 4 of this article from among those nominated in accordance with Section 3 of this Article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election and each retiring officer shall turn over to the successor in office all properties and records relating to that office within $\mathbf{3 0}$ days after the election.

SECTION 3. Nominations. No person may be a candidate in a club election who has not been
nominated. During the month of September, the Board shall select a Nominating Committee consisting of three members and two alternates, not more than one of whom may be a member of the Board. The Secretary shall immediately notify the committeemen and alternates of their selection. The Board shall name a chairman for the committee and it shall be such person's duty to call a committee meeting, which shall be held on or before the October meeting.
(a) The committee shall nominate one candidate for each office and position on the Board and, after securing the consent of each person so nominated, shall immediately report their nominations to the Secretary in writing.
(b) Upon receipt of the Nominating Committee's report, the Secretary shall, at least two weeks before the November meeting, notify each Club member in writing of the candidates so nominated.
(c) Additional nominations may be made at the November meeting by any member in attendance, provided that the person so nominated does not decline when their name is proposed, and provided further that if the proposed candidate is not in attendance at this meeting, the proposer shall present to the Secretary a written statement from the proposed candidate signifying willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one position.
(d) Nominations cannot be made at the annual meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this Section.

SECTION 4. Elections. The nominated candidate receiving the greatest number of votes for each office shall be declared elected. The three nominated candidates for other positions on the Board who receive the greatest number of votes for such positions shall be declared elected. . If no valid additional nominations are received at the November meeting the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected and no balloting will be required. Any uncontested position shall be automatically elected.

SECTION 5. Club's Official Year. The club's Official Year shall begin immediately at the conclusion of the election at the annual meeting and shall continue through the election at the next annual meeting.

## ARTICLE V <br> Committees

SECTION 1. The Board may each year appoint Standing Committees to advance the work of the club in such matters as dog shows, obedience trials, trophies, annual prizes, membership, and other endeavors which may well be served by committees. Such committees shall always be subject to the final authority of the Board. Ad Hoc committees may also be appointed by the Board to aid it on
particular projects.
SECTION 2. Any committee appointment may be terminated by a majority vote of the full membership of the Board upon written notice to the appointee; and the Board may appoint successors to those persons whose services have been terminated

## ARTICLE VI <br> Discipline

SECTION 1. American Kennel Club Suspension. Any member who is suspended from any of the privileges of the American Kennel Club automatically shall be suspended from the privileges of this club for a like period.

SECTION 2. Charges. An individual member may prefer charges against another individual member for alleged misconduct prejudicial to the best interests of the club. Written charges with specifications must be filed in duplicate with the Secretary together with a deposit of $\$ 100$, which shall be forfeited if such charges are not sustained or entertained by the Board following a hearing. The Secretary shall promptly send a copy of the charges to each member of the Board or present them at a Board meeting. The Board shall first consider whether the actions alleged in the charges, if proven, might constitute conduct prejudicial to the best interests of the club. If the Board considers that the charges do not allege conduct which would be prejudicial to the best interests of the club, it may refuse to entertain jurisdiction. If the Board entertains jurisdiction of the charges, it shall fix a date for a hearing by the Board not less than three weeks nor more than six weeks thereafter. The Secretary shall promptly send one copy of the Charges to the accused member by certified mail return receipt requested, or other form of receipted or acknowledged delivery together with a notice of the hearing and an assurance that the defendant may personally appear in his own defense and bring witnesses if he/she wishes.

SECTION 3. Board Hearing. If the Board has a hearing, the Board or a committee appointed by the Board may hear the charges. The Board, or the Board's appointed committee shall have complete authority to decide whether counsel may attend the hearing, but both complainant and accused shall be treated uniformly in that regard. Should the charges be sustained after hearing all the evidence and testimony presented by complainant and accused, the Board or the Board's appointed committee may by a majority vote of those present reprimand or suspend the accused from all privileges of the club for not more than six months from the date of the hearing. And, if the Board or the Board's appointed committee deems that punishment insufficient, it may also recommend to the membership that the penalty be expulsion. In such case, the suspension shall not restrict the defendant's right to appear before his/her fellow members at the ensuing club meeting which considers the Board's recommendation. Immediately after the Board or the Board's appointed committee has reached a decision, its finding shall be put in written form and filed with the Secretary. The Secretary, in turn, shall notify each of the parties of the Board, of the Board's appointed committee's decision and penalty, if any.

SECTION 4. Expulsion. Expulsion of a member from the club may be accomplished only at a meeting of the club following a hearing of the Board or the Board's appointed committee and upon the Board's or the Board's appointed committee's recommendation as provided in Section 3 of this Article. Such proceedings may occur at a regular or special meeting of the club to be held within 60 days but not earlier than 30 days after the date of the Board's recommendation of expulsion. The accused shall have the privilege of appearing on his or her own behalf, though no evidence shall be taken at this meeting. The President shall read the charges and the Board's findings and recommendation, and shall invite the defendant, if present, to speak on his or her own behalf, if he or she wishes. The members shall then vote by secret ballot on the proposed expulsion. A two-thirds vote of those present and voting at the meeting shall be necessary for expulsion. If expulsion is not so voted, the Board's or the Board's appointed committee's suspension of the accused shall stand.

## ARTICLE VII Amendments

SECTION 1. Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws may be proposed by the Board of Directors or by written petition addressed to the Secretary signed by 20 percent of the voting membership in good standing. Amendments proposed by such petition shall be promptly considered by the Board of Directors and must be submitted to the members with recommendations of the Board by the Secretary for a vote within three months of the date when the petition was received by the Secretary.

SECTION 2. The constitution and bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds secret vote of the members present and voting at any regular or special meeting called for the purpose, provided the proposed amendments have been included in the notice of the meeting and mailed or emailed to each member at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting.

SECTION 3. No amendment to the constitution and bylaws that is adopted by the club shall become effective until it has been approved by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club.

## ARTICLE VIII Dissolution

SECTION 1. The club may be dissolved at any time by the written consent of not less than two-thirds of the voting members in good standing. In the event of the dissolution of the club other than for purposes of reorganization whether voluntary or involuntary or by operation of law, none of the property of the club nor any proceeds thereof nor any assets of the club shall be distributed to any members of the club, but after payment of the debts of the club, its property and assets shall be given to a charitable organization for the benefit of dogs selected by the Board of Directors unless prohibited by State Law.

## ARTICLE IX Order of Business

SECTION 1. At meetings of the club, and at the meetings of the Board, the order of business, so far as the character and nature of the meeting may permit, shall be as specified by the current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised"

## ARTICLE X <br> Parliamentary Authority

SECTION 1. The rules contained in the current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised," shall govern the club in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any other special rules of order the club may adopt..
